Permanent Impairment Allowance



If you have been injured in the line of duty to an extent that prevents you from reaching your career potential, Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) has a program that can assist you financially. The Permanent Impairment Allowance (PIA) is a monthly amount—payable for life—for Veterans who have lost gainful employment opportunities because of a severe and permanent impairment resulting from their military service.

Who qualifies for the Permanent Impairment Allowance?

You may qualify if you have:

- a severe and permanent impairment for which you have received a disability benefit, and
- a VAC-approved rehabilitation plan.

How do I apply?

Your VAC case manager can assist you with your application. If you do not have a case manager, the staff at any VAC office or Integrated Personnel Support Centre (IPSC) can assist you. Important information

- If your impairment is so severe that you have been designated "totally and permanently incapacitated," you may apply to receive a PIA supplement that increases the amount you receive by an additional \$1,047.53 per month.
- Both the PIA and its supplement are deemed to be taxable benefits by the Canada Revenue Agency.
- Both the PIA and its supplement are adjusted each year in accordance with the consumer price index to protect you against the effects of inflation.

Key terms

A **severe and permanent impairment** identifies those who require supervision or assistance with daily living tasks and have conditions such as: an amputation; a total and permanent loss of vision, hearing or speech; or a severe and permanent psychiatric condition.
